Order Merchandise for Attendees (shirts, hats, booklets, etc.)
Submit Volunteer Liability Insurance Coverage Forms (list all names of mentors & instructors)
Print Materials (Waiver forms, LTH Safety Guidelines, emergency contact list, etc.)
Organize Food & Drinks (supper 2x, breakfast 2x, lunch 2x, water, coffee, etc.)
Wild Game Cleaning Supplies (tables, knives, cutting boards, plastic bags, paper towels, etc.)
Cooking Supplies (cast iron skillet, recipes, grill, coffee pot, crockpot, silverware, etc.)
